Nata nel 2018 dall'intuizione di un gruppo di giovani neurologi con consolidata esperienza clinica e scientifica nella gestione della Sclerosi Multipla, la Junior Academy of Multiple Sclerosis (JAMS) raggiunge nel 2026 l'ottava edizione, confermandosi un appuntamento di riferimento per la formazione delle nuove generazioni di medici che si avvicinano allo studio delle malattie infiammatorie del sistema nervoso centrale.

L'edizione 2026 è coordinata dal Prof. Massimiliano Di Filippo (Università di Perugia) e dal Prof. Emilio Portaccio (Università di Firenze) e si svolgerà nella suggestiva cornice di Assisi, luogo ideale per un confronto scientifico stimolante e partecipato.

Il programma, articolato su tre giornate di lavori, propone un percorso formativo dinamico e interattivo: verranno approfonditi i più recenti avanzamenti sui meccanismi patogenetici, sui criteri diagnostici e sugli algoritmi terapeutici della Sclerosi Multipla e delle malattie infiammatorie del sistema nervoso centrale.
